



# HOPE PLACE RESIDENT EXPECTATIONS

HOPE Place Transitional Housing Program is an opportunity for youth, age 18-24, to empower themselves and prepare for a bright future. It is the expectation of the program that if you are accepted into this program, you are ready and willing to take advantage of the available resources and work towards a brighter future for yourself!

**As a resident of HOPE Place Transitional Housing Program, you are ready to actively engage in the following:**

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1. Meet with the Program Manager and/or Youth Coordinator on a weekly basis at a regularly scheduled time, to be scheduled around your work/school schedule.
2. Attend all Mandatory Community Meetings (unless otherwise discussed with Program Manager)
3. Meet with the Anoka County Workforce Center personnel and enroll in the Empower Program to:
  - a. Complete basic education
  - b. Enroll in work experience, internship, or other employment-related activities
4. Complete ALL required Anoka County Financial Services paperwork to secure GRH funding for rent
5. You MUST reside at HOPE Place 5/7 days per week
6. You must complete 10-20 hours of documented productivity per week. These may include:
  - a. Working, or employment related activities
  - b. Volunteering
  - c. Attending meetings with your case manager, mental health professionals, CareerForce personnel, doctor appointments, etc.
7. You may be required to engage in mental health services including individual therapy, chemical dependency treatment, and/or ARMHS assistance, depending on situation.
